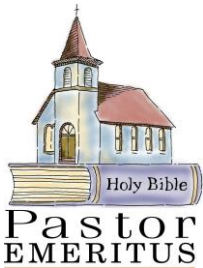

Friends,

I love you. I hope you know the depths of my love for you. The Lord has called me to serve you as your Pastor, but not only has the Lord called me, you have extended that call to me as well, and for that I am daily in awe. But I simply want to share my affection for you in this brief note.

It has been over four years since I first met you. There have been ups and there have been downs. But I want you to know that through it all my affection for you has grown. For Kim and I, you are our family. The Lord has knit me to you as your Shepherd, to belong in the work of caring for your spiritual needs. This is my calling to which I joyfully serve with you daily. When you are joyful, I'm joyful. When you are sorrowful, I'm sorrowful. The calling of a pastor is to share the joys and sorrows of life with the body of Christ. If I did not love you, neither your joys or sorrows would affect me. But O' how knit I am to you. Do you know how much I love you?

I have often shared a fourfold goal for my ministry with you: *As a result of my ministry at Bellevue, I want my congregation to treasure the Lord, delight in His Word, love His people, and pursue His holiness in their lives.* This calling drives the countless hours with which I serve you. But it's the third goal I want to highlight here, a love for God's people.

Our church survey made it clear to us that the biggest area for growth is loving relationships. We have been through a lot in the last year together and some relationships have suffered, so this makes sense. However, it still breaks my heart. I hope in this next season of ministry we can, to steal what the Triple T group stands for, "turn the tide" on our love for one another. To that end, I will be preaching a sermon series on August 27<sup>th</sup> and September 3<sup>rd</sup> on the unity and love of the church and would ask you to be there as we continue to grow in our love for one another. I will speak frankly on some of the issues we have been through and offer some hope for how we move forward.

1 John 4:11 states that "we should love one another." Why? What's the reason behind our love? Because *God has loved us* and knitted us together as the church. In Christ we are, present tense, in unity! Bellevue, let us look forward to the future of our family with a fervent desire to love one another with the love of Christ. John Calvin says "Christ loved all His people, so that they *would* love one another." Bellevue, I love you. Let us grow in loving one another.

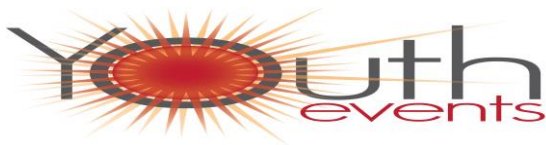

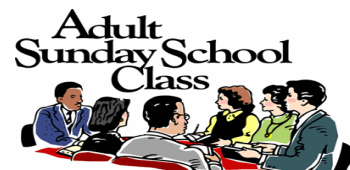
**ADULT SUNDAY SCHOOL FALL

**BEGINS SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 3<sup>rd</sup>**

***The Sermon on the Mount***—Join your brothers and sisters in an in-depth Bible Study on the *Sermon on the Mount* from Matthew 5-7. This class will be using a study guide from Jen Wilkin and each member will be encouraged to spend time each day in the workbook studying the passage for the week on their own. Then on Sundays the class will come together and discuss what they have learned together. So if you like diving deep into God’s Word, and even a little homework, join this class as Jesus shapes how we are to live.

***The Greatest Chapter of the Bible: Romans 8***—For many, Paul’s sweeping chapter 8 in his epistle to the Romans is considered the greatest chapter in all of the Bible. Come see why! This class will be an inductive Bible study, teaching and encouraging you to study God’s Word from the inside out using some particular Bible study skills. The class will also be guided by watching John Piper study this passage with pen and highlighter in hand, learning from his insights as well. Romans 8 is a life-altering chapter. Join us as we study it together.

***Behold Your God: Rethinking God Biblically***—How do you view God? This video course, led by Dr. John Snyder, unpacks a different attribute of God weekly through the lens of a biographical sketch of a significant figure in Christian history, such as George Whitefield, Charles Spurgeon, Amy Carmichael, Jonathan Edwards, and more. Then Dr. Snyder will lead us with Scripture to see the truths of our God we often neglect and take for granted. Each class will then end with discussion on how it applies to your life. If you dig a good theology class, this one is for you.
